TSU observes IP awareness month



Tarlac State University joined the nation in celebrating the 2021 National Intellectual Property Month, through the Technology Development, Transfer and Commercialization Office.

Foundation Course on IP

TDTCO conducted a webinar, "Foundation Course on IP for Faculty Members", the first of the series of webinars prepared for the month-long celebration. It was attended by 50 faculty members from different colleges of the University and was graced by the presence of VP for Research and Extension Services, Dr. Armee N. Rosel.

Discussed were the basics of Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) and the Technology Transfer and Commercialization (TTC) process of the University by Engr. Emir Lenard S.F. Sicangco, TDTCO Director and Ms. Francelle L. Calub, TTC Unit Head, respectively.

Patent Search and Claims Drafting Workshop

To continue the university-wide celebration of the National Intellectual Property Month, Tarlac State University (TSU), through the Technology Development, Transfer and Commercialization Office (TDTCO), commenced its 3-day workshop on Patent Search and Claims Drafting on April 12, 2021. It aims to gear up the faculty-innovators and -inventors of the University in preparation and application of their inventions and innovations for patent.



Dr. Adrian Bon B. Santiago, an established inventor and innovator, imparted his invaluable knowledge on intellectual property rights and patent search and drafting to the participants from different colleges of the University, namely, College of Science, College of Teacher Education, College of Business and Accountancy, and College of Engineering and Technology.

Through the guidance of Dr. Santiago, Engr. Emir Lenard SF. Sicangco, and Dr. Lea B. Milan, Director of Food Technology and Research Center, the participants identified their respective priority project to work on in the duration of the 3-day workshop. Each participant had to work on the said project to come up with a patent draft ready for its application.Present also were Dr. Armee N. Rosel, Vice President for Research and Extension Services, Dr. Edjie M. Delos Reyes, Director of the University Research Office, and Dr. Dennis V. Cantre, RD Lead for TSU.

On the workshop's second day, held on April 13, 2021, Dr. Adrian Bon B. Santiago, proceeded in discussing the technical know-hows and techniques of patent search. The attendees, meanwhile, actively participated by presenting their prior activity on conducting a patent search and by providing a comprehensive presentation of their inventions and innovations. The afternoon session is given to the participants for the accomplishment of their activity for intensive patent search related to their works.

The three-day workshop has concluded on April 20, 2021.
